#### Mark 11.1-10

When Jesus and his disciples drew near to Jerusalem to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village opposite you and immediately after entering it, you will find a colt tethered on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone should say to you 'Why are you doing this?' reply, 'The master has need of it and will send it back here at once.'" So they went off and found a colt tethered at a gate outside

on the street and they untied it. Some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They answered them just as Jesus had told them to, and they permitted them to do it. So they brought the colt to Jesus and put their cloaks over it. Many spread their cloaks on the road and others spread leafy branches that they cut from the fields. Those preceding him as well as those following kept crying out: "Hosanna! Blessed is he whom comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the kingdom of our father David that is to come! Hosanna in the highest."



As we begin our journey through Holy Week, I pray that we all get to live each day of this special week in reverence, reflection and reticence. To help you with your personal Holy Week pilgrimage, we are offering Eucharistic Adoration on Monday from 9:30am until 5pm and on Tuesday and Wednesday from 9:30am until 6:15pm. I encourage you to take some time from your busy day to spend time in prayer. It doesn't have to be a full hour, come sit in the presence of Jesus for any time that your schedule allows. We will also

have Stations of the Cross booklets available on the table in the main entrance of the Church if you would like to follow in the steps of Jesus during your adoration prayer; please return them to the table when you are finished.

Benediction and Holy Mass are scheduled for Tuesday and Wednesday at 6:15pm each evening. Celebrating the Holy Mass is the greatest prayer we can pray. The Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith. I invite you to make these Holy Masses a priority in your Holy Week journey, receiving the grace of God to bless us with a deeper understanding of the celebrations to come.

May our Parish Family join together to follow Jesus in the days leading up to his Passion and Resurrection. And may we pray for all in our world who are suffering, in mind or body, in countries torn apart by war, in isolation, in fear and anxiety, and those whose families are divided. May the strength of Jesus in his suffering and the peace of Jesus in his obedience surround us during this holiest of weeks.

If you are sensitive to incense and will be attending the Holy Thursday, Easter Vigil or Easter Sunday Masses, we will have seating available in the Nursery. The door will remain closed and there is a fan in that room for ventilation.

#### St. John the Baptist Parish Easter Basket Blessing Saturday March 30 at 2pm



The blessing of the Easter Basket has been a cherished Catholic ritual for centuries among families of Eastern European origin and adopted by people of all ethnic backgrounds who enjoy this richly symbolic custom. On Holy Saturday, families would prepare their Easter Baskets to be later blessed at church. After Easter Sunday's Resurrection Mass, the family

would share this blessed food and exchange good wishes. The Christian significance of Easter is symbolized in the foods used for the Holiday feast. Baskets are lined with a white cloth and decorated with ribbons and greenery to symbolize spring, renewal, and the Resurrection. Traditionally, the baskets would include: decorated hardboiled eggs (representing Christ's Resurrection), lamb-shaped butter or sugar (representing Christ as the "Lamb of God"), bread (symbolic of Jesus as the "Bread of Life"), ham (symbolic of great joy and abundance), sausage (symbolic of God's favor and generosity), smoked bacon (symbolic of the overabundance of God's mercy), some prefer lamb (representing Christ as the "Lamb of God"), salt (symbolic of prosperity and justice and to remind us "You are the salt of the earth"), cheese (symbolizes the moderation Christians should have at all times), horseradish & pepper (symbolic of the Passion of Christ and the bitter herbs of the Passover). A white candle is often inserted into the basket to represent Christ as the "Light of the World." Lastly, the basket is covered with linen symbolizing the covering of Christ's shroud. Children are excited to participate in this heart-warming tradition by helping to prepare and decorate the family basket and later, proudly carry it into church on Holy Saturday for the blessing. Some families with small children have their "little-ones" carry their very own decorated basket filled with fruits, a chocolate bunny or some other treat to be blessed. The foods included within any basket can be easily personalized.

### **GOOD FRIDAY WALK OF THE CROSS**

Join us on Good Friday, March 29, as we carry a cross throughout Estevan, stopping at churches for scripture reading, prayer, song and reflection.

The walk begins at 1pm at Trinity Lutheran Church and will include stops at the Salvation Amy, City of Estevan (City Hall), St. Giles Anglican Church, St. John the Baptist Catholic Church and St. Paul's United Church.

All are welcome to take turns carrying the cross. If you are not able to walk the whole distance, you are welcome to drive or ride to the next station.

# **Divine Mercy Sunday**

The Sunday after Easter is known as Divine Mercy Sunday. Began by a Polish nun, Sister Faustina Kowalska, in the late 1930s, we are encouraged to place our trust in God's mercy and receive His grace into our lives. Seeing the importance of this message, Sr. Faustina was canonized on April 30th,

2000 by Pope John Paul II who declared that, from that time forward, the second Sunday of Easter would be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

> How to pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy Use an ordinary 1. Make the Sign of the Cross rosaru 2. Pray an Our Father, Hail Mary and The Apostles' Creed 3. On the Our Father beads say: Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world. 4. On the Hail Mary beads say: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world. 5. Repeat for the five decades. 6. Conclude by repeating this prayer 3 times: Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Let us join together praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet on the second Sunday of Easter this year, to receive forgiveness and mercy from the Risen Lord.

## Sacred Triduum

As Christians, we are obliged to be present during the Sacred Triduum. This season in the Church opens with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, reaches its climax in the Easter Vigil, and closes with Evening Prayer II on Easter Sunday. These services flow into one another and are full of beautiful rites and traditions.

Following the Holy Mass on Holy Thursday, we are all asked to leave the Church in silence. Adoration will be taking place in the Church until midnight that night. You are welcome to stay and pray after the Holy Mass or you can come back anytime until midnight.



On Good Friday, the Church of God fasts (as well as Holy Saturday) to honour the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare to share more deeply in the joy of his resurrection. You are invited to join the Ecumenical Walk of the Cross at 1pm on Good Friday. The Walk will begin at Trinity Lutheran Church and will continue to different stops within our city center. When we come to the Church for the Good Friday Liturgy, we are asked to come in silence and to leave in silence that day. We also begin the Easter Vigil in quiet and in darkness. These periods of silence are very meaningful in our journey through the Sacred Triduum.
